The MRJ Performs Autopilot and Avionics Tests During Return Flight

After the exhibit at PAS, the third flight test aircraft (FTA-3) arrived at Moses Lake, around 4:00pm local time on the 24th, by way of Iceland's Keflavik International Airport. During the trip, FTA-3 gathered data on its GPS, weather radar and autopilot systems and confirmed their functionality. Also en route, about 500 employees of engine partner P&W and UTC Aerospace Systems toured the MRJ and welcomed the aircraft with a water cannon display during a stop at Bradley International Airport in East Hartford, Connecticut, home to the P&W headquarters.
